From Our Pastor

As we approach the end of this year and prepare for the start of 2025, I find my heart overflowing with gratitude, trust in the Lord, and the spirit of Thanksgiving. I want to take a moment to share an important update with you: beginning the day after the first Sunday of January, I will step away from ministry for 9 weeks to undergo an intensive surgery I've mentioned a few times. The surgery will take place in mid-January, and I will be hospitalized for two weeks or more, followed by time for recovery.


