Happy New Year! As we enter 2025, I pray that our church is inspired by the Hebrew word) היי (Hai),' meaning "life," to guide our theme for the

year. This powerful word invites us to reflect on three meaningful dimensions of our faith journey:

Hi –We are called to embody the love of Jesus by warmly greeting our neighbors and extending true hospitality. Each encounter is an opportunity to share Christ's welcoming spirit, fostering fellowship and community. Through small gestures of kindness and openness, we can make a profound impact in reflecting God's love for the world.

Hai – (אד) This word reminds us of God as the Creator and sustainer of all life. We celebrate the sacredness of life, recognizing our connection to God's life-giving breath. This aspect of our theme invites us to cherish the beauty of creation, honor the divine spark within each of us, and live with gratitude for the gift of life itself.

High – In humility, we acknowledge God's sovereignty as the One who reigns above, holding all creation in God's care. This recognition invites us to trust God's guidance and grace as we navigate life's joys and challenges. Living humbly before God keeps us rooted in faith and dependent on God's wisdom and strength.

This year, our ministry will continue to focus on four foundational aspects of a missional church: Word, Education, Fellowship, and Service.

- **1. Word** Let us immerse ourselves in the Word of God, allowing Scripture to shape and inspire our daily lives.
- **2. Education** Through Bible studies, small groups, and learning opportunities, we grow in understanding and strengthen our faith.
